The **Kwara State Education Trust Fund (KwaraETF)** was established under the Kwara State Education Trust Fund Law (2021) and strengthened by the Amendment Laws of 2023 and 2025. Its purpose is to create a sustainable, transparent, and independent mechanism for mobilizing funds that enhance access, quality, and equity in education across the State.

A Kwara where accessible and inclusive education powers innovation and endless opportunities for all.

- Mobilize funds from government, private sector, and donors for educational development.

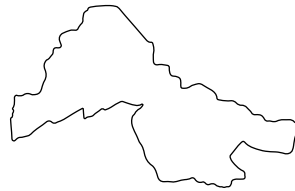

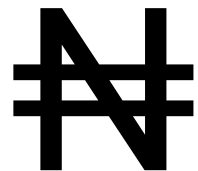

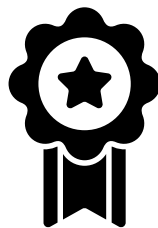

# Program Highlights & Human Stories

## 1. Scholarship Program – From Mock to Mission

### Unlocking the dreams of Kwara’s brightest minds.

In the 2024/2025 school session, the Kwara State Education Trust Fund launched its flagship Scholarship Program, a life-changing initiative designed to identify and support brilliant pupils in public primary schools who might otherwise be left behind. Through a rigorous and transparent selection process led by **KwaraLEARN**, **640 pupils** across **16 local government** areas participated in a statewide mock National Common Entrance Examination (NCEE). From this pool, **180 pupils** were shortlisted for registration support, and **12 exceptional students** earned **full six-year scholarships** to pursue their secondary education. These scholarships are more than financial aid – they are a promise of possibility. Each beneficiary receives tuition support, learning materials, and mentorship from educators and alumni mentors to help guide their academic journey.

### Program Design

- Assessment: Statewide mock NCEE across 16 LGAs.
- Support: Payment of registration, transportation, and exam-day logistics.
- Sponsorship: Full scholarship for top-performing pupils from public schools.
- Monitoring: Continuous mentoring, tracking of attendance and performance

### Impact So Far

- 640 pupils participated in mock exams statewide.
- 180 received financial and logistical support for the NCEE.
- 12 scholars currently on full sponsorship (2025 cohort).
- Increased transition rates from primary to secondary schools.

### Looking Ahead

In 2025/2026, KwaraETF aims to scale the Scholarship Program to reach 500 pupils across all LGAs, introduce alumni-led mentorship, and integrate digital performance tracking tools for real-time progress monitoring.

## 2. Rewarding Excellence – The Presidential School Debate Story

**Behind every champion is a great coach.**

KwaraETF believes that excellence deserves recognition. When pupils from Kwara State emerged victorious at the 2024 Presidential School Debate Championship, the Fund ensured that both the students and their teachers were celebrated and rewarded. For the first time, not only were the students acknowledged, but the teachers who trained, mentored, and inspired them were also recognized – reinforcing the message that great teachers shape great achievers. In partnership with the State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB), KwaraETF awarded cash prizes, learning materials, and institutional support to the winning students and their schools. The event showcased Kwara’s rising educational excellence and set a new precedent for celebrating both learners and educators.

## 3. Adopt-a-School Initiative – Rebuilding Futures

**When communities lead, schools thrive.**

Education thrives when ownership is shared – and that’s the principle behind KwaraETF’s Adopt-a-School Initiative, introduced in late 2024 to mobilize alumni, philanthropists, and private partners in restoring public school infrastructure.

The initiative features three tiers of partnership:

- **Bronze (₦150 million, 8 weeks)** – Targeted repairs, furniture, and sanitation.
- **Silver (₦300 million, 12 weeks)** – Structural renovation and classroom modernization.
- **Gold (₦500 million, 16 weeks)** – Comprehensive rebuild, including ICT labs and solar lighting.

The program’s pilot phase will begin in the three senatorial districts ensuring equity in access.

### **2025 Target**

Renovate 16 schools under the Adopt-a-School Initiative – one per LGA – with priority given to rural and underserved areas.

This structure guarantees oversight, while the Secretariat, led by the Executive Secretary, executes policies and manages programmes in line with global best practices.

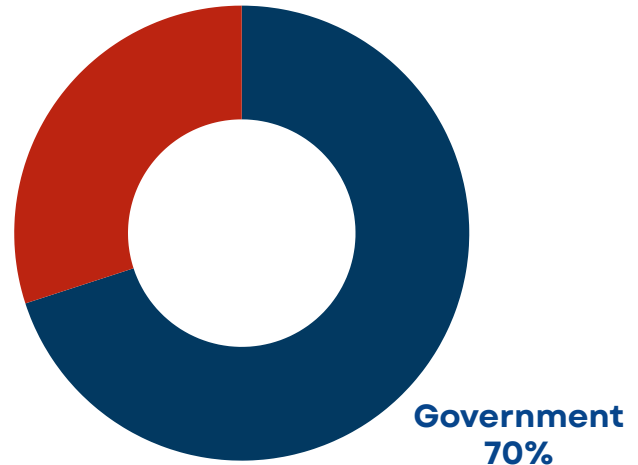

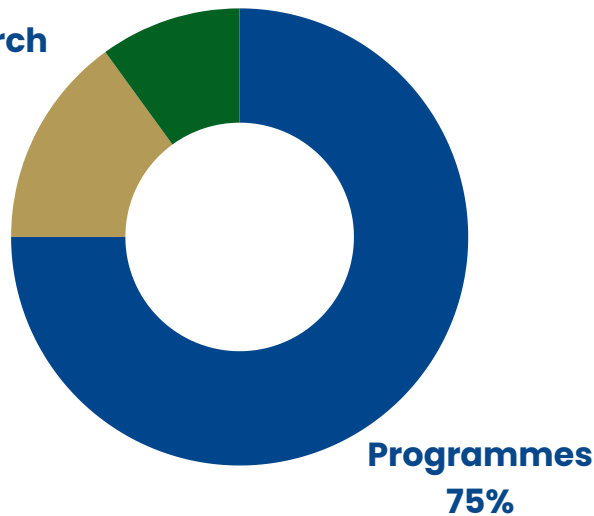

## 6. Institutional Strengthening & Legal Framework

In 2024, the Kwara State Education Trust Fund (Amendment) Law was passed, marking a new era of independence and sustainability for the Fund. This amendment:

- Expanded the Fund’s revenue sources (including endowments, levies, and voluntary donations).
- Strengthened governance and administrative efficiency.
- Clarified reporting obligations for transparency and audit integrity.

The amendment positions KwaraETF not only as a fund manager but as a credible public trust – one that embodies accountability, results, and sustainability

# LOOKING AHEAD: 2026 PRIORITIES

As KwaraETF continues to grow, the focus shifts from early impact to systemic transformation.

**Our goal:** to build a sustainable education ecosystem that ensures every child, regardless of circumstance, can access quality education.

### 1. Scale the Scholarship Program

→ Support 500 students across 16 LGAs through merit-based selection and mentorship.

### 2. Renovate 16 Schools Across Kwara

→ Fully roll out the Adopt-a-School Initiative, delivering infrastructure upgrades and learning facilities.

### 3. Deepen Partnerships & Resource Mobilization

→ Expand corporate and alumni participation through the KwaraETF Prospectus and fundraising drives.

### 4. Advance Monitoring & Evaluation

→ Deploy digital tools for real-time tracking of learning outcomes and fund utilization.

### 5. Enhance Public Engagement & Communication

→ Strengthen awareness campaigns and stakeholder dialogue for inclusive education policy.

### 6. Digital Integration of Secondary Schools

→ Work with partners to digitize learning management systems and teacher training tools.
